Dear Members and Friends of Saint Timothy's,

We begin November with one of my favorite and treasured feasts, All Saints' Day. There are ways in which particular days and holidays rise to be a "favorite" in our lives. I think it's because recollections of special events bubble up to the surface of our memories that occurred on those particular days. It may be that the foundational principles undergirding the institution of that holiday have a deep meaning for us. Whatever the reasons, we all have particular days and times that are especially meaningful and it varies for each of us. I don't know exactly why one is All Saints' Day for me. It could be something as simple as it happens in the fall and I like the cool nights and warm days of autumn. It could be that the first parish where I served as curate, All Saints', Ashmont, in the Dorchester section of Boston, was a wonderful start to my ministry. I've always liked that dedication for a church: All Saints' or All Hallows'. I spent seven momentous and meaningful years in that parish that has all the Saints as her title and dedication. Part of the reason for this deep affinity, and even love, for All Saints' Day, too, is the meaning it has, and the definition it brings, to the Church. For me, The Communion of Saints is the Church.

All Saints' Day means that we are giving due honor and praise to those who have been part of the Church here in the world. Because of their excellent and faithful witness here, we are confident and sure that they have received their reward and are perfectly spiritually united to the Trinity in heaven. They are where we should long to be and vet, because it is the same Holy Spirit dwelling in them, as in us, we are united to them too. This means that "The Church" is one big spiritual Body of the living and the dead. The Saints are united to us by their spiritual holiness and we are united to them because in their humanity, they were once here in the world as we are. That kind of unity, that kind of holiness, that kind of universality (catholicity) defines The Church for me. Thank God that He made the Church, through His Son, to be this way. I need it and love it.

This is why we baptize on All Saints' Day. It is the day in which we bring into this Spiritual Body, the Church, those who need to be bound by the Holy Spirit. Once one is baptized, the same Holy Spirit dwelling in the souls of the faithful, also comes to claim, and dwell in, the soul of the Baptized. The Baptized become members of The Church, The Body of Christ, at that point. Those baptized at any age have the stain of Original Sin, the sin of Adam, washed away, and the Holy Spirit comes to live with that soul.

In keeping with The Church's sacred and fine tradition, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Baptism on All Saints' Day. It falls this year on a Sunday and we are fortunate to have a good number of souls to baptize. We have offered the opportunity to have children from our parochial school, who have yet to be baptized, join us in the celebration. We will have a number of children receive the Sacrament of Baptism from the parish and from the school. Please remember them in your prayers as they prepare to begin their life as a Christian.

All Saints' Day will be celebrated in all its splendor on Sunday morning, November 1st, and we will continue a celebration later that day. Our 2016 Stewardship Celebration will be Sunday, November 1st, beginning at 5:00 p.m. The Stewardship Committee is hosting a barbecue for all of us and it is a barbecue that cannot be missed. Renowned Cooper's Barbecue from here in Raleigh will be here so we can enjoy not only their barbecue, but fried chicken, potatoes and everything else that goes along with North Carolina barbecue. (I should say "eastern" North Carolina barbecue). We are really celebrating Saint Timothy's Church and all we love about Saint Timothy's. We have committed to pledging and supporting our parish through the 2016 Every Member Canvass and now we can give thanks to God that He has given us this wonderful parish and thank Him for all the blessings we have received by being part of it.

Thank God for the witness of all the Saints. They inspire us. They pray for us. We pray with them as part of the Church. Thank God for the witness Saint Timothy's makes and thank God for the opportunity to support that mission and ministry. It is just a joy and privilege to be part of The Church and especially to be part of The Church in this corner of His Kingdom called Saint Timothy's.

STEWARDSHIP TALK FROM OUR JUNIOR WARDEN GIVEN ON SUNDAY, OCTOBER 18

For those of you who do not know me I am Ed Watson, Junior Warden, on the Saint Timothy's Church Vestry. I would like to take a few minutes to talk about **Planning, Hope and Promise**. As I stand before you, I realize I may be preaching to choir, as the saying goes. I appreciate your patience and listening.

First under Planning: We at Saint Timothy's are a faithful and special parish family. It is the responsibility of the Vestry and Clergy to plan a responsible budget just as you plan a budget with your family. I personally am very excited about the plan for the future of Saint Timothy's Church that you will hear more about from Cathy Elsea, our Senior Warden.

<u>Next under Hope</u>: It is my hope that we will continue our commitment to the programs, staff and clergy at Saint Timothy's. As I see our children each Sunday, it is my hope for them to have a future at Saint Timothy's that is vibrant and nurturing for them to grow in their faith.

As for Promise, we know a promise is a commitment we make. We learn throughout life that it is important to not break a promise. The planning and hope for our parish depends heavily on the pledge that we make which is our promise to support Saint Timothy's. Another important aspect of our promise is that we pay what we pledge in a timely manner so that funds are available as needed. I am sure most of you would recognize the hardship in your family if you did not receive your monthly income as expected. It would make it hard to know whether to buy groceries or pay the light bill. The very same fact holds true at our Saint Timothy's home. When the Vestry and Clergy make plans, and promises are not fulfilled, meaning pledges are not paid in a timely manner, we have the same difficulty that you have if your family did not receive its monthly income.

In January and February of 2015, due to severe winter weather, many people were not able to attend services at Saint Timothy's, sometimes resulting in shortcomings when it came time to pay monthly bills. If there are circumstances where members cannot meet their pledge, all they need to do is to contact Debbie Nicholas, Parish Administrator, and make the necessary adjustments. Again, this is necessary for the Vestry and Clergy's planning.

What we give to God and His church is about so much more than money. It is about commitment, it is about having hope and a vision for the future of St. Timothy's and it is about sharing our gifts, including your special talents and resources. You are loved no matter what you put in the plate. My hope is that because you are a child of God and are so overwhelmed by His love and His vision for Saint Timothy's that you cannot help but give.

We have a crown jewel in Saint Timothy's and we have what we have because it was given to us by the grace of God. Stewardship is about the good management of these talents and resources.

In summary, I hope you will celebrate with me as you hear of our plan for the future of Saint Timothy's and that you will keep hope alive for all members of our parish family and that you will make and keep your promise to support the programs, staff and clergy of Saint Timothy's Church.
