Dear Members and Friends of Saint Timothy's,

We are beginning the wind up into all the fall activities here at our Church and our School. As I write this letter our parochial school has just had its first full day of school and the excitement and anticipation is all over the faces of the children. They are so happy to be back in the classrooms where they get reacquainted with their friends, learn more about their new teachers, and are seemingly happy to be back in our excellent school. I have never seen so many children truly want to be in school after the summer. There is something about the warm, intimate, caring place that is Saint Timothy's School. I think it's the combination of an academic program, presented in such a loving and supportive Christian way that just makes it attractive. The Lord is truly at work in our School and that is pleasing.

We also have our Church School (the classes that meet on Sunday, and not Monday through Friday) that is preparing to begin a new school year. We can read all about getting children and young adults registered for the Church School in the article in this issue of *The Tidings*. The Church School is directed by our Director of Christian Education and Parish Life, Sarah Culton. She will say that there is always a need for more Church School teachers. We have eighteen but we need more. Teaching in our Church School is one way to serve the Lord that will reap immediate rewards and also benefits we will not even see because they are benefitting children and young persons' souls.

If you are looking for a way to live out your faith (putting your faith in to practice) in very helpful and beneficial ways, then please consider spending some of your time teaching some of our Church School classes. We have a wonderful group of young people of all ages here at Saint Timothy's and it is encouraging to work with them. They will benefit because they will know more about Our Lord and you will benefit because you will have a hand in another's spiritual development.

How do we measure the effects of our teaching, worship and fellowship on young persons' lives? I know Saint Michael's Conference has a deep and long-lasting effect on the spiritual life of our high school and college students, but how do I come to that conclusion with any confidence? There's no way to have systematic collections of data when it comes to how a young person is growing spiritually and truthfully, I don't really want to apply scientific evaluation to such a personal, spiritual aspect of our young persons' lives. There is no way to tell

if they're growing spiritually by attending the Conference except by anecdotal reports. I supposed there is some empirical data in the fact that they go back to the Conference year after year. If it were not something they wanted to do, believe me, they would not do it. The enthusiasm, the interest and the excitement they express before, during and after the Conference, has to suffice for evidence that it is a very good thing for them to be doing. Please read the article that has written about this year's Saint Michael's Conference and see if the Conference provides an excellent opportunity for the spiritual growth of our young people

It is the topic of "growth" for both the Church and the School that we're trying to address in beginning the creation of a master plan for our property. We are engaging Ratio Architects, Incorporated, a Raleigh firm, to design and create a master plan for our property. A master plan is a measured, planned, well thought through, architectural plan that incorporates the details of the vision we have as a Church and a School for the buildings and property God has given us. Think about what our Church and our School ought to look like and what they ought to be capable of doing five, ten, fifteen or even twenty years down the road. This master plan will have taken all the thoughts, wishes and hopes of the people whom we serve and laid them out in a way that will help ensure we can do the things we want to do for the next decade or decade and

In order to have an effective master plan the architects will need our help. We will be given the opportunity to have the architects visit our Vestry and collect their thoughts and their vision for what the Church should be over the next number of years. Between now and September seventeenth let our Vestry members know your thoughts on how Saint Timothy's Church ought to be improved. Do we need a larger, more functional and more handsome parish hall? Do we need larger and more up-to-date bathrooms? Is there adequate meeting space for our groups? Can we produce the meals, parties, classes, and storage space that will adequately meet our needs? What do we have that we should not have, and what don't we have that we should have? These are the questions we should be asking ourselves, letting the Vestry know what we think, and passing these thoughts on to the architects. Think big and, as they say, "Think outside the box!"
